

Discover Haga Park



Book a guided tour

The lush Haga Park is unique. It's a part of the Royal National City Park, a stone's throw from Stockholm's city. It's one of Europe's best-preserved English landscape parks. Gustav III's Pavillon in neoclassicism is a highlight of Swedish art history. Haga is also the residence of Crown Princess Victoria and her family.

The guide Michael Karlsson will show you the northern part of Haga Park with focus on the monarch Gustav III, the architects and the workers who commissioned, designed and constructed the park in the end of the 18th century.

- Enjoy the beautiful sight from the Copper Tents overlooking the park and the lake Brunnsviken

- Listen to the story of the fateful masquerade ball at the Opera in 1792 where Gustav III was assassinated
- Be enchanted by the huge foundation of the Great Castle

Michael Karlsson's tours in Haga Park are known for the mix of knowledge, storytelling and wit. In his company you will discover the outstanding historical park with its buildings, forests and meadows. And also get to know the king who brought a piece of Italy to Sweden and changed the country through two bloodless revolutions.
